Our Vision

SAGE imagines an affordable housing development for older adults in Baltimore that is built specifically with the LGBTQ+ community in mind. This development would contain numerous independent-living apartment units and would be affordable to those in the community with significant financial need. It would also include community gathering spaces, LGBTQ+ affirming programming, and connections to a variety of local services. This development would celebrate all of the beautiful things that make us who we are, and it would offer a safe and affordable place for Baltimore's LGBTQ+ older adults to live, age, and build community.

Our Work so Far

SAGE has spent the last year engaging the Baltimore community to gauge interest in this type of housing and explore the feasibility of bringing a project like this to the area. Data from focus groups, surveys, and individual interviews indicate that this type of housing is deeply desired in Baltimore City; data also indicate that it is indeed possible for this building to come to Baltimore.

SAGE has established a partnership with <u>Pennrose Development</u>, the developer behind both The Pryde and the John C. Anderson Apartments, listed above. (Pennrose's regional headquarters is located in the heart of Baltimore!) We have also built strong partnerships with a number of prominent local community organizations, particularly those that serve the LGBTQ+ community.
